ATTENDANCE POLICY

Peaks Presbytery Youth Council is a unique way for 9th-12th graders to gain valuable leadership skills, learn more about the Presbyterian Church (USA), get to know other youth from the Presbytery and serve the church in an important and challenging way.

Peaks Presbytery Youth Council meets six (6) times a year. Extra meetings are called as the need arises. Transportation to the meetings is the responsibility of the members.

The Council is made up of 18 youth and 9 adults. It is preferred to have only two Youth Council members from a particular church. However, a maximum of four will be considered if space is available.

Youth who serve on the Presbytery Youth Council must:

- Be an active member in their local church and youth activities
- Be a rising 9th – 12th grader and able to serve a 2-year term or until graduation
- Be an exemplary role model to other youth
- Be willing to make Youth Council a priority in their schedules and be very regular in attendance to meetings and events.

The Peaks Presbytery Youth Council is responsible for:

- Planning and implementing weekend retreats and events for Senior Highs and Middle School youth
- Planning the Presbytery-wide youth events so they are balanced in worship, recreation, fellowship and study
- Promoting Presbytery and General Assembly opportunities for youth participation from our churches
- Serving as liaisons between local churches and the Presbytery for promotion of events and communication in general.



The input of every member of the Youth Council is important. Thus, every effort should be made to attend all meetings.

Two unexcused absences within a school year will be grounds for dismissal from the Council. Absence from a retreat counts as two absences.

Efforts will be made by the Chair of the Youth Council to keep members informed of their attendance responsibilities so that it may not be necessary to dismiss any members.
