## **News From our CEDEPCA Partners**

Our brothers and sisters in Guatemala also are experiencing shelter at home orders. The entire country has a curfew from 4 p.m. to 4 a.m. Shops and markets are closed and anyone over 60 is not allowed out of their home. To date, 239 cases of Covid-19 have been reported in the country and there have been 6 deaths. One of the greatest fears in the country is the return of deportees from the U.S. These people are sent back to Guatemala with no masks and little testing for the virus although many of them have been exposed to the virus in the U.S. detention centers. With a fragile and inadequate health care system, an outbreak of the Covid-19 could devastate the country. Many of those who return are subjected to harassment from society and are being blamed for bringing the virus.

The good news is that the work of CEDEPCA's Disaster Ministry has helped to create strong communities that will be able to survive the pandemic. CEDEPCA has helped them to plant family gardens where they are raising vegetables and chickens to feed their families. The counselors have taught communities how to take care of themselves psychologically and spiritually in times of disaster. The Biblical and Theological studies program continues to hold classes with pastors and lay people online. And, the Women's Ministry is continuing to meet with community leaders to help women who are trapped at home in situations where there could be abuse.

A new PCUSA Mission Co-worker, Betsey Moe, has been hired to work with CEDEPCA. Currently, she is at her home in Spokane and she will go to Guatemala as soon as she is able to do so.

Please continue to pray for our partners in mission. They are grateful for our support and our relationships through the years. This relationship continues to sustain them.

# **Additional Funding Requested for SBA CARE Act Loans**

Additional funding for the Small Business Administration CARE Act loans may be approved by Congress and available by the end of this week. Check with your local bank regarding the status of current applications (some banks are processing the current applications to have ready for submission if additional funding is approved).

It appears that churches had better response to their applications through smaller, local banks such as Select Bank, Bank of the James, Pinnacle Bank, First National Bank and American National Bank. There can only be one application per organization and only one loan per organization (defined by tax ID number). Additional information will be provided as events occur.
