

LEXINGTON, Kentucky — Registration is now open for CPJ Training Days, a virtual advocacy and organizing event April 7-9.

CPJ Training Day, presented by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Office of Public Witness and its fellow Compassion, Peace & Justice ministries, traditionally takes place in person at New York Avenue Presbyterian Church in Washington, D.C., on the day before Ecumenical Advocacy Days, a weekend-long event in Northern Virginia. For the second consecutive year, both events will be virtual due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

This year, CPJ Day expanded to three days to provide a breadth of content around this year's theme, environmental justice, without the potential Zoom fatigue of a day-long online event. Each day will start at 11 a.m. Eastern Time and go to 12:30 p.m. On April 7 and 8, there will be small group gatherings at 1:30 p.m. ET. Registration is free.

Ecumenical Advocacy Days are set to take place just over a week later, April 18-21, and will have a similar theme of environmental justice this year. Registration is now open, and is \$25 until April 1.

Community Outreach Block Grant Notice

Twenty-three Community Outreach Block grant applications, to be considered for 2021 funding, have been received. The Presbytery of the Peaks has funds budgeted, through the Mission Committee, for annual Block Grants. Local community organizations providing tutoring programs, clinics, adult care, jail ministry or other community care programs are eligible to apply. The money for these grants is dispensed by the Grant Work Group of the Mission Committee. In order to hopefully award the projected amount to each applicant, those applying have received the following communication:

Thank you for submitting a Community Outreach Block Grant application, requesting financial support from the Presbytery of the Peaks (POP) to assist with the significant community work of your organization/ministry.

The POP is in the midst of transformation, implementing a new way of being and operating that will ultimately allow us to be more faithful and relevant in who we are and what we do. In order to best support 2021 grant applicants, the POP Grant Work Group plans to award grant funding in May instead of March. This delay, as we work through the transformation process, will allow more generous funding
