Given that the world will have changed, the former is probably not wise. If this transition stage is not managed well, congregations might emerge showing more signs of what was lost than what has been learned.

At this Zoom event, Dr. George Anderson, pastor of Second Presbyterian Church of Roanoke, will lead us through a short presentation followed by breakout and large group discussions.

### Minimum Wage Increase

The Minimum Wage in Virginia is increasing to \$9.50 effective May 1, 2021. This is a \$2.25 increase over the current minimum wage of \$7.25 per hour. The current law requires an increase in minimum wage on January 1, 2022 to \$11.00 per hour and on January 1, 2023 to \$12.00 per hour.
