PRESBYTERY OF THE PEAKS STATED MEETING MINUTES

Thursday, February 17, 2022; 9:00 a.m. via Zoom

The Moderator, Helen Dean, called the February 17, 2022, Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of the Peaks to order at 9:00 a.m. The meeting was opened with prayer by the Moderator.

Rev. Carl Utley, our General Presbyter, welcomed the Presbytery and introduced Keenan Rodgers from Board of Pensions.

The Stated Clerk declared that a quorum was present and submitted the consent agenda for approval.

Consent Agenda

No consent items were removed, and the agenda passed by consent.

Stated Clerk Search Committee Report

The Stated Clerk Nominating Committee nominated the Rev. Betsy Soto for the office of Stated Clerk for the Presbytery of the Peaks effective February 17, 2022. This motion was approved. The Stated Clerk is elected to a 4 year term according to the Peaks Presbytery Manual of Operations.

Report of the Stated Clerk Nominating Committee February 2022

The Stated Clerk Nominating Committee of the Presbytery of the Peaks was elected by Commissioners at the November 2021 Presbytery meeting and was comprised of the following members: Helen Dean (Elder), Rev. Kim Steinhorst, Rev. Bob McLavey, Rev. Cheryl Peeples (Secretary), and Howard Jennings (Elder, Chair). The committee was given the tasks of reviewing the office and position description of the Stated Clerk, determining an application process, conducting interviews with applicants, and proposing a nominee for the office of Stated Clerk for Presbytery action at the February 2022 Presbytery of the Peaks stated meeting.

Normally the Stated Clerk search process is scheduled to take a year to complete. We had a challenging schedule to finalize the search in about two months which also include three major holidays. Rev. Carl Utley (Executive Presbyter) assisted our committee by providing an orientation training session.

The committee met eight times on Zoom from December 7 – February 1, 2022.

We started by revising the Stated Clerk Job Description/Qualifications (and sought the approval of the Committee on Administration - Personnel Work Group). These revised documents were then posted on the Presbytery of the Peaks website.

We advertised the open position in *Peaks Postings* from early January through January 25, 2022. We received two applications for the position. We interviewed each via Zoom and made our unanimous selection on February 1, 2022. We are blessed to present to you an outstanding nominee at today's Presbytery meeting.

MOTION: The Stated Clerk Nominating Committee nominates the Rev. Betsy Soto for the office of Stated Clerk for the Presbytery of the Peaks effective February 17, 2022.

Our Presbytery is also blessed to have had the wonderful leadership of our current Stated Clerk Rev. Dave Baker over the past year. Dave has served us well during his time as Stated Clerk, as parliamentarian, problem solver and encourager. He has been a colleague in ministry and faithful friend to many as well. We thank Dave, with grateful hearts, for his service in our Presbytery.

We offer our thanks to the Presbytery staff for their valued support during this search process. We also want to thank the Committee on Administration for approving the Stated Clerk Job Description/Qualifications in such a rapid, timely manner.

I also want to personally thank the members of this committee who used their varied gifts and talents to make this action of Presbytery possible. They served you, the Presbytery of the Peaks, faithfully with distinction and made our time together a joy, privilege and honor for each one of us. Thank you, Madame Moderator and fellow commissioners, for giving us this opportunity to serve.

• Mark Rackley to serve as pastor at St. Andrew Presbyterian Church, Lynchburg.

After questioning, Elizabeth moved that presbytery sustain Mark's examination, enroll him as a member of the presbytery and authorize the Committee on Ministry to form an Installation Commission. This motion was approved by consensus and Mark was received with joy as a minister member of the Presbytery of the Peaks, pending presbytery's approval of the transfer of his ordination to the PC(USA).

Report of the Examinations Committee

We are bringing one candidate to the floor for the Presbytery Meeting. His Biographical Statement and Statement of Faith are included.

• Mark Rackley to serve as pastor at St. Andrew Presbyterian Church

Mark Rackley Biographical Statement

I was born on December 15, 1967, to Frank and Johnnye Rackley in Austin, TX, where I lived for the first eighteen years of my life. Austin was a wonderfully eclectic environment in which to grow up. My home congregation growing up was the First Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Austin. As a child, it was my second home. I am a fourth generation Cumberland Presbyterian. Mom played the organ and dad sang in the choir so I sat in my grandparents 'laps during worship until I was too big for that. Both of my parents worked with the children and youth of the congregation and presbytery. They served as elders and deacons throughout their lives. Most of the adults knew me and greeted me by name. I knew their faces and I knew that they were my church family. The seed for my call to ministry was planted through my home church.

The youth and camp ministry of the presbytery made a huge impact on my faith development and on my discerning process of a call to ministry. South Texas Presbytery had a strong children and youth ministry. We had quarterly presbyterial rallies. We went to camp together every summer. We traveled together to Camp NaCoMe in Centerville, TN, where our denominational camp, the Cumberland Presbyterian Youth Conference (CPYC), was held for many years. We participated in the Presbyterian Youth Triennium when it came around. We stayed connected even outside of the regularly scheduled church events. I had opportunities to serve in leadership positions on all levels of the youth ministry for our presbytery and denomination helping to lead worship, recreation, and small group Bible study as well as serving on design teams. By the end of my senior year of high school, I was talking with friends and mentors about my struggle with a call to ministry.

Bethel University was the next step in affirming my call to ministry. After graduating from high school, I decided to go to Bethel University in McKenzie, TN. I earned a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics from Bethel University because I enjoy math and because people told me to have something on which to fall back in the event that I₈did not go into the ministry. At the end of my sophomore year in college, I started working with the children and youth at the Milan Cumberland

Presbyterian Church in Milan, TN. The math classes as well as some of the other subjects in college were fun and stimulating but true joy came when I was working with the people in the church. The call to the ministry continued to grow and I started looking at seminaries.

I considered attending Memphis Theological Seminary since it is a Cumberland Presbyterian institution. After growing up in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and spending four years at Bethel University, a Cumberland Presbyterian institution, I wanted to hear and experience a new point of view. Three of my professors at Bethel (Dr. William Ramsay, DeVier Ramsay, and Dr. Peter Hobbie) encouraged me to look at their alma mater, Union Theological Seminary and the Presbyterian School of Christian Education in Richmond, VA. The dual degree program where I could earn a M. Div. and a M. A. in Christian Education appealed to me because of my interests in youth ministry. After visiting the campus and experiencing the community, I knew that UTS/PSCE was where I wanted to study.

In the summer of 1990, I started Greek school at UTS/PSCE. While in seminary I met my wife Michelle. I also participated in classes that I enjoyed even more than math. I worked with the children and youth at Colonial Heights Presbyterian Church (PCUSA) in Colonial Heights, VA. My joy continued in my studies and my work. My call to ministry grew stronger.

I completed my studies at UTS/PSCE in 1994, earning a M. Div. and a M. A. in Christian Education but Michelle still had two more years of study at UTS/PSCE. We got married in the summer of 1994. I continued my work at Colonial Heights Presbyterian Church. I also started working in the Media Center at the library at UTS/PSCE while Michelle finished her degrees. My home presbytery confirmed my call to the ministry of Word and Sacrament in December of 1995 when they ordained me in my home congregation in Austin.

Michelle completed her M. Div. and her M. A. in Christian Education in 1996. That summer, we accepted a call to be co-pastors at the Cowan Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Cowan, TN. We served that church for one year and nine months.

We moved to Rydal, GA, in April of 1998, where I was called to be the solo pastor of the Bartow Cumberland Presbyterian Church. April of 2022 will mark twenty-four years of ministry with this congregation. All three of our children (Anna, Paul, and Sarah) were born in this community. This church family has helped us to raise our children. This congregation has also helped to shape me into the minister that I am today.

Anna is a sophomore at Cartersville High School. She is active in the chorus and drama departments of her school. She is also very active in a local community theatre program. She loves to cook and take on projects. Paul is a freshman at Belmont University in Nashville, TN. He has not yet declared a major. He loves music, theatre, and watching sports events. Sarah is a junior at Maryville College where she is working towards a major in sociology, a minor in religion, and a certification in congregational ministry. She is currently sorting through seminaries to which she wants to apply.

I have maintained an active part in the Christian Education aspect of ministry throughout my life. Summer camps and conferences are regularly scheduled events on my calendar. I consistently serve on the boards and agencies of the presbytery. I have enjoyed helping with the events and projects on the denominational level throughout the years. I have always enjoyed helping to bring people together to glorify God as a community of faith.

In my spare time, I enjoy cooking, reading, going to the theatre to watch a show, cycling, hiking, watching a baseball game, and anything to do with music. Most of all, I enjoy spending time with my family.

Michelle and I want to move to Virginia to be close to her parents as they are getting older. They live in Christiansburg, VA. Cumberland Presbyterian congregations are not located in Virginia. In our planning to move, I have looked at jobs outside of the church but I truly believe that I am called to serve the church as a minister of Word and Sacrament. I feel that serving in Presbyterian Church (PCUSA) makes the most sense to me. Having received my theological education from a Presbyterian (PCUSA) school will help in this transition as well as having worked with the Presbyterian Church (PCUSA) on a regular basis throughout my career. The theology of the Presbyterian Church (PCUSA) align with my beliefs and practices. I look forward to moving into this new position to which the Holy Spirit has called.

Mark Rackley Statement of Faith

I believe God is with us. This belief affects the way that we see ourselves and the world around us. It guides our actions. It gives us hope when we are feeling hopeless. It gives us comfort in our times of grief. It is fuel for our joy when we are celebrating God actions. It is a beacon when we are passing through dark times. It is truth when the world is questioning what is truth. It brings us peace throughout each day. God is with us.

I believe God came into the world as a human, taking on flesh and blood and interacting intimately with humanity. God interacted with all of creation prior to Jesus. God's words and very breath created life and order out of chaos. We have heard and read the stories of the burning bush, the wrestling match in the night, the pillars of smoke and fire, and all of the dreams. But when Jesus was born, it was different. He changed the lives of so many people: short ones, hurting ones, taxing ones, wealthy ones, and in fact every one of them. I believe God came to us in a new way through Jesus.

I believe God remains with us even after Christ ascended and that is manifested through the actions of God's community of believers. Matthew tells us that the risen Christ gave the disciples a commission: "Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always to the very end of the age." (Mt 28:18-20) These words of assurance, "I am with you" and "Emmanuel" book end Matthew's witness (Mt 1:23; 28:20). Knowing that God is with all of us reassures me and inspires me to keep going each day, even to the end of the age.

I believe God continued to work in the lives of the disciples and everyone who came in contact with them through the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus did not stick around with his disciples after giving them the great commission. Thanks to Luke, we know that he left the disciples right where they were, waiting in bewildered anticipation as he ascended into heaven (Lk 24:50-53; Acts 1:10-11). Luke continued the story of how God fulfilled God's promise to send the Holy Spirit so that we are not alone or without God's life giving and sustaining presence. People heard the Good News and understood what was being said to them. People turned to God for forgiveness and for a new life in a new community of faith based on the Good News that God is with us. God continues to open the lives of people by bridging gaps and taking away barriers and traditions of society.

- 2. Recommend to approve the transfer of membership for Rev. Mark Rackley from Cumberland Presbytery to Presbytery of the Peaks via the process outlined in G-2.050a (2), granting Rev. Rackley an exemption from full ordination requirements by a two-thirds vote of the presbytery.
- 3. Recommend to grant permission to Committee on Ministry to appoint an Installation Commission to install Rev. Mark Rackley at St. Andrew Presbyterian Church.
- 4. Recommend that Dave Robert's call at St. Andrew Presbyterian Church be changed from Associate Pastor to Co-Pastor.

Re: Overture to the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church

Date: December 7, 2021

In 2019, Savannah Presbytery submitted an overture to the 224th General Assembly (scheduled for Baltimore in 2020). As you know, the 224th General Assembly did not handle any overtures due to COVID. Therefore, this overture will again come before the General Assembly in the summer of 2022. I encourage the Presbytery of the Peaks to concur with this overture.

The title of the overture was "On Streamlining the Sale of Property Given to a Congregation as a Gift to Fund Ministry and Mission." This overture will allow gifted real estate to be treated just like giving appreciated securities (stocks and bonds). Seven other presbyteries (Cincinnati, de Cristo, Florida, Grand Canyon, Mississippi, Redstone, and Sierra Blanca) have concurred with this overture. As I was the overture advocate as a member of Savannah Presbytery, I am familiar with the rationale behind the overture. Having relocated two churches to new campuses during my ministry while serving as pastor through six building campaigns, I have firsthand experience on the need for such a change to our *Book of Order*.

This overture will be OVT-040 for the 2022 General Assembly. If you look at pc-biz.org, you will see that the Advisory Committee on Social Witness Policy recommends approval of the overture, while the Advisory Committee on the Constitution (ACC) does not. I am willing to address the concerns the ACC raises, as well as to challenge several of their claims.

Second Overture Dave Baker

Recommendation

The Presbytery of Northeast New Jersey respectfully overtures the 225th General Assembly (2022) to direct the Stated Clerk to send the following proposed amendment to the presbyteries for their affirmative or negative votes:

Shall F-1.0302 (c) be amended by inserting the following words [Text to be added is shown **in bold**.]:

"Because the church is catholic, it strives everywhere to testify to Christ's embrace of men, women, and children of all times, places, races, nations, ages, **abilities**, conditions, and stations in life."

and F-1.0404 be amended by inserting the following words [Text to be added is shown **in bold**]: "a new openness in its own membership, becoming in fact as well as in faith a community of women and men of all ages, races, ethnicities, **abilities**, and wordly conditions, made one in Christ by the power of the Spirit, as a visible sign of the new

humanity."

Further, the Presbytery of Northeast NJ recommends that disability be included in future lists of marginalized people in policy, procedure, and liturgy.

Rationale

The current foundational statement (F-1.0403) already uses language inclusive of people with disabilities. This amendment seeks to use consistent language around disability throughout the Foundational statements of the book of order.

"Well Chosen Words" (2010) states Using inclusive and expansive language is one way to acknowledge and celebrate all people and bring recognition and a sense of belonging to people who have been historically marginalized in society and even in the church." This amendment would reflect this overture by making all parts of the Book of Order consistent in their inclusion of people with disabilities.

People with disabilities include 26% of the US population (CDC, 2020) making it the largest minority group in America. People with disabilities represent an important part of our church and they should be named in lists of people to be included.

Research shows a significant participation gap for people with disabilities into the life of the church (Ault, Collins and Carter, 2013). The inclusion of people with disabilities in our polity shows our intention to be inclusive of this group.

We identify as being "people of the word," marking both our commitment to Biblical scholarship and exegesis and the importance of the words that we use when preaching, teaching, and guiding our church's polity. These small corrections reflect the value and importance that we put on the use of consistent inclusive language throughout our policies.

Summary of Actions for 2021:

Paycheck Protection Program

The Trustees and Committee on Administration approved for the Presbytery of the Peaks to participate in the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) for COVID 19 relief. The Presbytery received a second grant from the program in 2021 for \$49,500.

RD Holmes Presbyterian Church

At the May 2021 Presbytery meeting, the RD Holmes Presbyterian Church was declared extinct. The Trustees initiated action to have the deed transferred to Trustees of the Presbytery of the Peaks. This deed was issued in September 2021 along with title insurance. A subcommittee of the Trustees met at the church in December 2021 to inspect the property and meet the ruling members of the Community Pentecostal Holiness Church (this church has leased the property for the past six years).

Trinity Presbyterian Church, Ridgeway

The Trustees of the Presbytery of the Peaks were appointed as the Administrative Commission for the Trinity Presbyterian Church at the February 2021 Presbytery meeting. A title search revealed the property was owned by the PCUSA A Corporation. A deed of transfer was executed in 2021 transferring the property to the Trustees of the Presbytery of the Peaks. The Presbytery declared the Trinity Presbyterian Church extinct at the May 1, 2021 Presbytery meeting.

Glen Wilton Presbyterian Church

The Trustees oversaw the modified work on the Glen Wilton Presbyterian Church (deed to this property is held by the Trustees of the Presbytery of the Peaks). ECC contractors were employed four years ago to repair structural damage to the building caused by a tree falling into the bell tower. The contractor completed the modified work to waterproof and secure the building.

John Fedison and Walter Jones from the Trustees were appointed to the Administrative Commission for the Glen Wilton Presbyterian Church at the May 1, 2021 Presbytery meeting. Due to a reversion clause in the deed, the Trustees requested a title search on the property in 2021.

Blacksburg Presbyterian Church

The Trustees approved the request of the Blacksburg Presbyterian Church to sell property bequeathed to the church by a former member. Proceeds from the sale were slated to be allocated to the following:

50% to a fund for large grants for immediate mission giving

30% invested in an endowment for ongoing Mission giving locally and internationally 20% for unforeseen church projects or needs

Kayser Memorial Presbyterian Church

The Trustees approved payment to the Kayser Presbyterian Church for storm damage to the church property up to \$1,826.23.

Clarktown Presbyterian Church

The Trustees secured a deed and title insurance in the name of the Trustees of the Presbytery of the Peaks in 2021. The first payments to the Black Caucus churches from this property are slated for January 2022.
