2023 Board of Pensions Rate Increase

The Board of Pensions has approved an increase in the cost of the Pastor's Participation dues for the first time in five years. Effective January 1, 2023, medical dues will increase 2 percent, from 27 percent to 29 percent. As a result, total dues for the benefits package will be 39 percent of a ministers' effective salary, up from 37 percent.





EARTH CARE SUMMIT

The Presbytery of the Peaks Earth Care Workgroup will be hosting a **Presbytery Earth Care Summit** on **Saturday, October 1.** We want you to consider sending one or more representatives from your church to learn to strengthen your church's creation care activities, and to get some motivation, encouragement and resources for making it a ministry priority for your congregation.

- 1. the name of the best person/s in your congregation to contact with more details about this Earth Care Summit, including their contact email and phone number. It might be you!
- 2. We are also interested in your questions and concerns regarding earth care in your congregation. What would you like to have us include in this Summit, or a subsequent gathering?

To reduce travel time and still allow for face-to-face interaction, we plan to gather in three "hubs", connecting the hubs virtually through an in-person/virtual hybrid format from 11:00 - 2:00.

- Hub 2: First Presbyterian Church, Martinsville
- Hub 3: Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church, Lynchburg

Our hope is:

- to provide each congregation with resources they can take home to support/kickstart their work in creation care;
- to share ideas that have worked for congregations;
- to give folks some language to talk about the importance of engaging in creation care from a faith-based perspective; and
- to provide motivation and support for this urgent, essential and challenging ministry of caring for God's creation, in such a way that churches take the lead and provide models and witness for their communities.
