What is the Season of Creation?

The Season of Creation is an annual liturgical season (like Advent or Lent) in which the ecumenical family around the world unites in prayer and action to protect our common home.

The Season of Creation can be celebrated at different points in the church year.

- Most commonly, the Season of Creation has been celebrated between Creation Day on September 1 and St Francis of Assisi Day on October 4.
- Three or four sequential Sundays at another time of year.
- Several Sundays spread throughout the year.
- It can be at different times in different years.
