## Pastoral Wilderness Experience Survey

I am a Master of Divinity student at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary and a candidate in the ordination process under the care of the Pittsburgh Presbytery. I am in the beginning stages of designing and facilitating a restorative wilderness experience for pastors as part of my Adaptive and Innovative Ministry Emphasis project, as I seek to integrate my professional background in Adventure Education with my calling to ministry. # Radford Celebrates 150th Anniversary



The Presbyterian Church of Radford on April 14, 2024, celebrated their sesquicentennial (150th) anniversary. Everyone was welcomed by Rev. Morgan Whitfield Jr. We received a special accommodation from the Presbytery of the Peaks, given to us by Carl Utley, General Presbyter. Our guest speaker Rev. Dr. Lee Hinson-Hasty gave an inspiring message on "Fearlessness." He talked about the fearlessness of our forefathers and organizing a church in this wilderness. A historical room was set up for people to see our history. The children put together a timeline on the bulletin board in the hallway to show the growth of the Presbyterian Church of Radford and the growth of the city of Radford. Many former pastors and their wives joined us. We are grateful for our oldest member, Mim Smith, who is 102 and who has been a member since 1933. After the benediction given by Rev. David Dickerson. We gathered in the fellowship hall for a bountiful meal.

# Second Replaces Fluorescents with LEDs



Second Presbyterian Church Roanoke recently completed the replacement of 900 fluorescent tubes in the main church building with energy efficeint light emitting diode (LED) tubes. Partnering with Appalachian Power Company's (APCo's) Business Energy Solutions (BES) program, the church received a 30% rebate on the total project cost. The payback period is 3.5 years. Also, the church is projected to use 20%-30% fewer kilowatt hours (kWh) annually-effectively reducing the church's greenhouse gas emisssions that contribute to global warming.

Why do this? Because 2023 was the hottest year on record since global temperature monitoring of the land and the oceans began. 2024 is on pace to be even hotter than 2023. Paraphrasing Christian Climate Scientist Dr. Katharine Hayohe, "The planet is running a fever...and every degree of warming matters."
