

A Taste of Afghanistan at Westminster Presbyterian, Lynchburg







A Creation Care Garden

At Blacksburg Presbyterian Church, we have a Creation Care garden near our parking lot door, and between the sidewalk and the building. It is a relatively small garden, which we have been working with for nearly a decade, in which we seek to provide:

--a showcase for easy-to-grow native plants and "natives" (cultivars of native plants). See photo A: Inside the small kiosk is a laminated garden guide with names of the native plants, their characteristics and benefits to wildlife. We are not expert gardeners, so we grow plants that are not finicky and can thrive on their own without extra water or care. The primary maintenance needed is weeding (our soil is rich, so weeds grow well there, too), thinning and pruning.

--a home and food source for pollinators, over-wintering bugs, birds, and other critters. See photo B: The New River Plant Society recently gave us a "Native Pollinator Habitat" sign, designating our garden as good place for monarch butterflies. In the background of this photo, one can see goldenrod, common milkweed, joe pye weed and native asters (none of it blooming yet), which are loved by pollinators, including monarchs. See photo C: This photo shows a sign that says "Leaving leaves and flower stalks provides food and shelter for birds, butterflies, bees and bugs." Each year, we leave our leaves and stalks until mid-spring.

—a welcoming outdoor space for observing wildlife, enjoying the colors and textures of flowers, shrubs and trees, breathing in the floral scents, and listening to the calming sounds of birds, humming of bees, and the wind through the wind chimes. Our garden is open to the public, and enjoyed by





all the community members who visit our building, as well as our congregation. See photos C and D: We have a bench (acquired through collecting plastic film for the Trex company) and newly installed handpainted flagstones (a project done by our children) for even closer access. Photo D shows the wind chimes and the rainbow of colors during the height of the bloom season.

We hope that our garden can be an inspiration for your congregation or your home garden!





Earth Care Mini-Grants Due June 30th

The Earth Care Subcommittee of the Justice and Mercy Commission

encourages your congregation to apply for an Earth Care Mini-grant.

Just a few ideas you might consider: plant native plants; replace a dying tree with a native tree; purchase supplies for a community garden or for composting; buy recycling trash cans to recycle things in your community that can be recycled; install a bicycle rack; purchase a rain barrel for watering needs; replace incandescent or fluorescent bulbs with LEDs or lights with motion sensors to name a few.
