Join us for a day of learning, sharing and fellowship at Amherst Presbyterian Church. We'll start the morning with worship and a





## Conversations


What happens to faith when it becomes more about talking *about* Jesus than talking *to* Jesus? Do we risk reducing a living relationship to abstract ideas—Jesus becoming a topic rather than a presence? The Gospel of John resists such drift. It is a Gospel built on conversations—long, rich, and transformative ones. From Nicodemus under the cover of night to the Samaritan woman at the well, from a man born blind to Mary, Martha, and Pontius Pilate—Jesus doesn't just talk *at* people, he speaks *with* them. And they are never the same.

This October, the Bible in Black & White community will listen in on these conversations—and join them. Our hope is to encounter Jesus as we encounter each other, with open minds, honest hearts, and a willingness to be changed.

### **Earth Care: What We Eat**


As part of Covenant's Earth Care ministry for 2025, we asked the congregation to choose from various environmental topics they would like to explore. The top response was around food.

In addition to providing monthly newsletter articles on food-related topics like sustainability, pesticide reduction, buying local, composting, reducing food waste, and moving towards more plant-based food sources, we added earth-friendly items to our typical post-service Mingle & Munch fare.

This allowed us to practice what we preach, offering samples of plant-based milks and creamers along with organic fair-trade rainforest alliance coffee; organic applesauce oat muffins made with maple syrup and organic walnuts for a protein-packed breakfast option; a delicious lentil and chickpea stew topped with Greek yoghurt; and a variety of organic fruits and vegetables. The feedback was very positive, and the foods made for good conversation starters.



## Small Churches as Anchors in Their Communities

Below, Kim Jeffreys, shares some of what she learned at Small Church conference she and three other leaders from Peaks attended in Clarksville, Arkansas this summer. If you're a small church leader interested in learning more about how small churches are or can be anchors of their communities, join us at the Small Church Summit on September 27th--it's the topic of one of our workshops.

I have been to a few continuing education functions and often find that the information given is not very helpful for the size of our church and the location of our community. I was very excited to see if this conference would be a more inspiration conference. Over a hundred people from surrounding states attended this conference. It was a wonderful experience.

The conference was run by the Town Square Collaborative. It had several core principles including to help churches in rural areas and small towns to be the best version of themselves and serve as anchors in their communities. They reminded us that in large city churches charities and other organizations have taken over the importance of the church to the community. Because of where our church is located it is an institution to the community. People in the community look to us to be a leader and to guide. The conference facilitators spoke about the important and special work that our church does and reminded the attendees that if our churches didn't do the work...no one would. There is no one to step in in our communities. We serve an important role in our community and we need to recognize this and honor it.

# Earth Care, Church Partnership and Redevelopment Grants Available

The next Earth Care Mini-Grant Deadline is September 30th.

Earth Care mini grants are available for congregations seeking to engage in earth care ministry through worship, education, outreach or their facilities.

The next Church Partnership Grant Deadline is October 1st.

These grants are given to congregations for projects that strive to build partnerships to help foster discipleship within the presbytery.

Church Redevelopment Grants are being considered on a rolling basis.

The type of projects that will be considered intros program will have a goal of building relationships, provide a spiritual growth component and/or missional components oriented to the community in which the congregation displaced. Grants will be awarded based upon the potential for effective congregational development and community engagement.
