Upcoming Boundary Training



As you may know, boundary training is now constitutionally required by the Book of Order every 36 months - and our Presbytery is overdue! The trainings last two hours and will be conducted by Moderator of the Presbyterian Women, Pam Snyder. Each session/location will have the complete training, so you only need to attend one of the training sessions.

Above are the only times Boundary Training will be available in 2025.

Who needs this training?

All pastors, churches, and commissioned pastors must complete this training. Churches are required to send a representative as well.

What if I absolutely, positively, cannot make it?

Forward in Faith: 5th Avenue Presbyterian

5th Avenue Presbyterian Church is an approximately 143-year-old, historically African American congregation with a rich history that includes becoming a leading voice for the desegregation efforts of Roanoke and nurturing the faith of many persons recognized as prominent leaders in Roanoke, the state of Virginia, and the nation.

Situated in a now diverse, lower income neighborhood of Roanoke, 5th Avenue is an aging congregation with declining membership, dwindling resources and saddled with the worry of navigating the related costs of an underused church building, and a foreboding sense of "what to do?" However, even within the shifting theological climate of "Church" and what it means for the future, 5th remains committed to mission and outreach in the ways it can support such as neighborhood picnics, food drives, Nursing Home worship, etc., and embracing a hybrid worship model combining Zoom and in-person attendance.

It has been this "worry" combined with the commitment to community outreach that inspired the session of 5th Avenue to participate in the Forward in Faith Project. Of course, Forward in Faith is not a "miracle" cure to heal all Church wounds, both past and present, but the Project does promise to help congregations discern meaning and purpose while discovering the possibilities for underused buildings to better serve the community, and perhaps, offer an additional revenue/resource stream.

The Forward in Faith Project has offered new insight into discovering opportunities for 5th Avenue to play a larger role in its community. Already, examples of this come from session #3 of "Good Futures."

Tasked with walking the neighborhood and interviewing neighbors, 5th Avenue was able to learn that opening its parking lot during the week to our neighbors would prove to be very helpful, and a Blessing of the Pets event has been scheduled to take place in the next few weeks!

Peaks in Action: South Boston and Clarksville

Over the summer, First Presbyterian Church South Boston received a Church Partnership grant in partnership with Clarksville Presbyterian Church. They had several objectives for their project to pack a tractor trailer load of disaster relief buckets with God's Pit Crew. Beyond the obvious outcome of assisting those in need, one of their goals was to encourage cooperation between local churches. They did indeed raise the funds, coordinate volunteers and get the work done to fill 1008 buckets, including play pails for kids--and pray for those who will receive them. They hope to make this an annual event.

Presbytery Worship Theme: Earth Care




