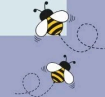

## BEE the Presbytery!

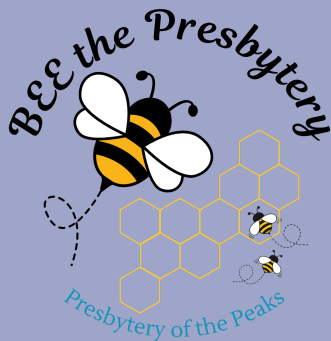
At the October presbytery meeting, a new purpose and priorities for the presbytery were adopted.

**Purpose:** Presbytery is the tie that binds our diverse contexts to share God's love by: Supporting, connecting, guiding, equipping, and resourcing ministries.

Guided by prayer and the Holy Spirit, shaped by the teachings of Jesus & united in the Reformed tradition the Presbytery seeks to carry out our purpose through the following priorities:

**Beloved Community, Equipping the Saints, Expanding the Kingdom.**

In 2026, we'll explore each priority--what each priority is, what pathways and actions we can take to live into them and what we can all do to BEE the presbytery together.

The UKirk campus minister aspires to be faithful to God, to love others as Christ loves us, and to trust the leading of the Holy Spirit as he or she nurtures the students, connects with UKirk's partner churches, and administers the campus ministry programs.

This is a part-time position of 25 hours per week. Duties include ministerial and spiritual leadership for college students through weekly meetings and activities; community engagement and communication of events; and supervision of an administrative assistant.

## Resources: Earth Care

Were you at the October Peaks Presbytery worship service? Were you inspired to encourage or lead your congregation to do more in earth care?

The Peaks Earth Care subcommittee would like to pass on a few resources you might find useful. *Note: If you were not at the meeting on October 23, please pass on this info to someone in your congregation who was there. Thanks!*

Our speaker at the service, Derrick Weston, is the Director of Education and Formation for Creation Justice Ministries, a national organization that works in cooperation with 39 national ecumenical faith bodies, as well as regional faith groups and congregants, to protect and restore God's Creation.

Every year, Creation Justice Ministries releases resources that aid in educating and equipping congregations and individuals for creation care. These resources cover a variety of topics and include toolkits, one-pagers and tools to share as bulletin inserts. You might also want to subscribe to their monthly Action Center newsletter, which offers a reflection, news, tips and resources for Earth Care.

In addition, Presbyterians for Earth Care, through the PCUSA, has 3 main goals:

- Connecting people through a grassroots network seeking to keep the sacred at the center of earth care, advocacy and action both inside and outside the walls of the church.
- Equipping members with resources, ideas and information for a shared journey toward a healthier planet by growing and sharing theological understandings and perspectives on eco-justice issues.
- Inspiring members through stories of individuals and groups who have responded to the sacred call to care for the earth – stories told person to person at events, and by newsletter, email, social media and devotions.
