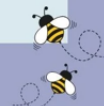

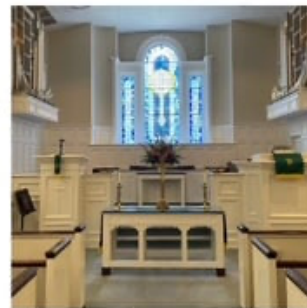

Spotlight: The Environmental Cost of Drinking Water Packaging

Did you know that Americans purchase over 50 billion plastic water bottles each year? Most are used once and discarded—with

only a fraction ever recycled. The environmental toll includes:

Plastic pollution: Bottles often end up in landfills or oceans, harming wildlife and ecosystems.

Carbon emissions: Manufacturing and transporting bottled water consumes fossil fuels and contributes to climate change.

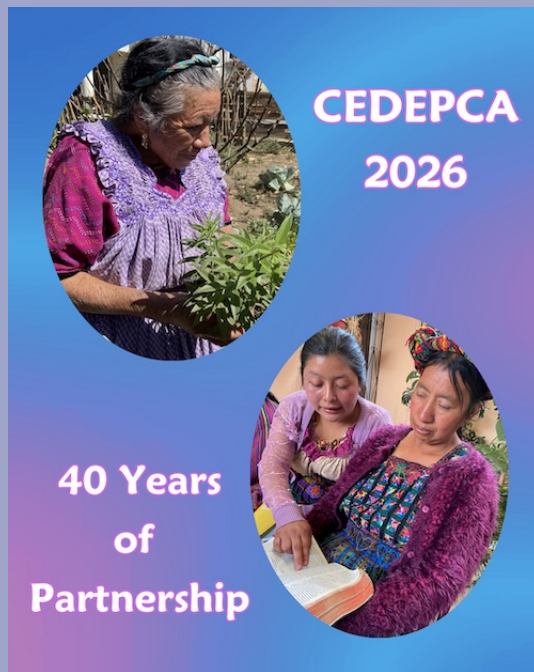
Water waste: It takes three liters of water to produce just one liter of bottled water.

Even alternatives like aluminum cans or cartons have hidden costs—from mining impacts to energy—intensive production. The most sustainable choice? A reusable bottle filled with tap or filtered water.

Faith in Action

This month, consider making a simple switch: carry a reusable water bottle, encourage others to do the same, and support policies that reduce single-use plastics. Small choices, multiplied across our community, can lead to big change.
